## Ascension Day

On Thursday 25<sup>th</sup> May we celebrated Ascension Day which marks Jesus' return to heaven and his last appearance on earth to his disciples.

This important event takes place 40 days after his resurrection on Easter Sunday and begins a period of nine days leading up to Pentecost on Sunday 4<sup>th</sup> June. During these nine days the disciples waited in Jerusalem for the coming of the Holy Spirit to empower them for the mission they had been given by Jesus - to make disciples of all nations.

Once again we are joining Christians across Canterbury Diocese using the daily prayers in the booklet 'Conversations in the In-Between'. This is an excellent resource and I would urge everyone to put time aside each day to listen to what God has to say to you during this time (26<sup>th</sup> May to 3<sup>rd</sup> June).
